2.3 Collective Impact

A recent impact study, sponsored by the Australian Government, demonstrated that Tutu Desks significantly improve the learning conditions and academic performance of children in underresourced schools. In this study, 76% of learners surveyed reported feeling more motivated after receiving a Tutu Desk, while 80% of teachers stated that they could interact more positively with their pupils. Additionally, close to 70% of learners believed they were concentrating better and that the quality of their handwriting had improved. This impact study collected data from 426 teachers at 52 schools, representing over 16,000 students who have used Tutu Desks for at least 24 months (Australian Government Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, 2016).
